Colorless, odorless and lighter than air, natural gas becomes combustible when mixed with air and exposed to an ignition source.



We add a sulfur-like rotten egg stench so you'll know right away if there's a problem.



Gas can hiss or even roar as it escapes from pipes.



Gas may make bubbles, blow dirt and kill plants when leaking from underground pipes.

If you notice a natural gas leak, quickly leave the area. If you're indoors, get outside fast. Do not use a phone, flip a switch, open windows or do anything else that may cause a spark. At a neighbor's house or from a safe distance, call 911 and Avista at 800-227-9187.
